OLEA GABON PARTNER OF THE PORT-GENTIL 10KM RACE

OLEA Gabon was one of the partners of the 5th edition of the Port-Gentil 10km which took place on April 8, 2023. Clément Chadeau, Managing Director of OLEA Gabon tells us about OLEA Gabon's involvement in this event.

What is the Port-Gentil 10km?

As its name implies, this is a ten-kilometer race held every year in Port Gentil. This year, the 5th edition was jointly launched by the President of the Republic, His Excellency Ali Bongo Ondimba, and Mr. François Perrodo, Chairman of the Perenco Group, the race's main and historic sponsor. The POG 10km calls itself «the fastest in Africa», as it brings together some of the world's top professionals, including Sir Mo Farah, four-time Olympic track and field champion, who was finalizing his training on the continent in preparation for the forthcoming London Marathon. Needless to say, the level of competition was very high for the OLEA team who took part in the race! Finally, in recognition of its excellent organization, the

race was awarded the Gold Race label by World Athletics for the first time.

How and why did you become a sponsor of this event?

We were asked by the Perenco Group in Gabon, of which we are also the broker, to replace the event's previous partner and become the official broker for the POG 10 km. After starting a partnership with the National Football League as an official broker, it seemed natural to us to support this event as a broker for athletes and sport!

What role did OLEA Gabon play at this event?

As official broker, OLEA Gabon provided the race organization with civil liability insurance for the event, among other contributions. This was a major commitment, because with an elite group (the world's best runners) and 13,000 runners taking part in all the competitions, the challenge was as much sporting as it was to insure the event.

How important is corporate sport to you?

Volunteers attend a complete physical training program, combining all the elements of fitness: cardio and muscular preparation, balance and flexibility. What's more, during a team-building event, part of the workforce took part in an introduction to golf. Finally, we created the OLEA CM FC. This is a soccer team made up of company employees and managed by an internal committee. The team has weekly training sessions, and matches are organized with other companies in the insurance sector. Our team is new to the company, but it has demonstrated great collective qualities and tenacity during these sporting encounters. »

Souhail Manai, MD OLEA Tunisia : « In 2022, our Motor Claims Manager, Seif Hanchi, suggested we enter OLEA Tunisia in the Pro League, a Tunisian soccer league for companies. We didn't hesitate, and Seif

quickly put together a fine team that quickly integrated itself into the league. It's a start, but it's already helping to unite soccer enthusiasts, and our team includes a large number of them! »

What do you have planned to motivate your employees to take up sport this year?

Maurice Bouzemarene, MD OLEA Cameroon: « We will continue to raise employee awareness of the positive effects of daily physical activity. We have already initiated a number of sports-related projects. This year, we're going to capitalize on what already exists before starting on new projects. »

They are particularly important for their individual accident coverage, which includes medical intervention after an injury (quick medical treatment of trauma can be vital), and for the protection they provide event organizers if their liability is questioned, especially for events attended by several thousand participants.

Sports-related insurance is inexpensive, offering the necessary insurance protection and should not be overlooked.

OLEA Services and OLEA Côte d'Ivoire on tour



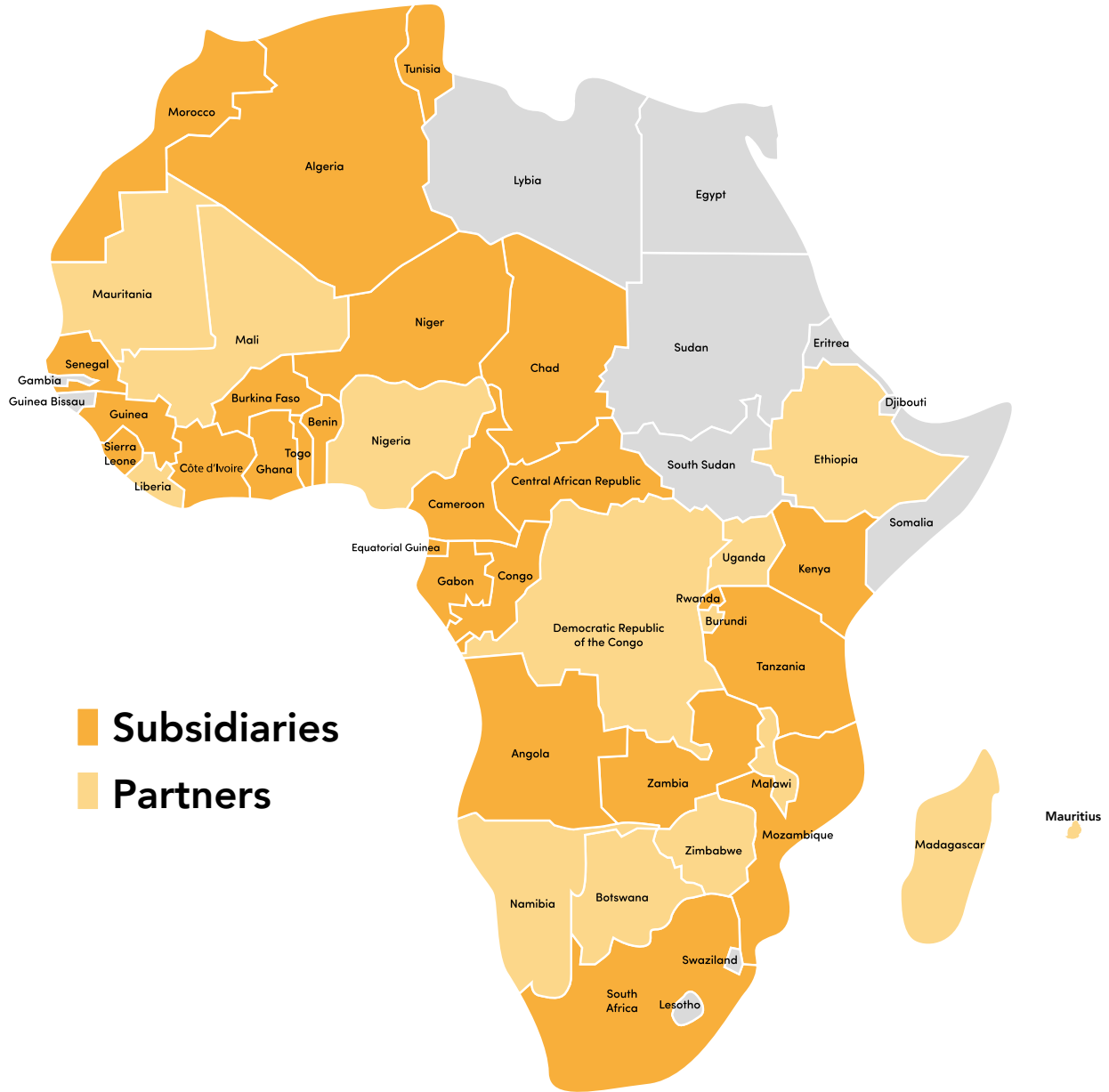
